This year marks Pastor Christine's 14th year at St. John's! Wow!!

To encourage the congregational health that comes with longer tenured leaders, and for the health and welfare of our called pastors, St. John's grants a sabbatical leave for their called pastoral leaders during every seven years of service, with a minimum length of three months in the seventh year.

Pastor Christine has offered to do a split sabbatical: six weeks starting on May 13 and returning on June 24. The second half of her sabbatical will be the end of December into January 2025. She has offered to split up the sabbatical because this is now a solo pastorate, although she is not required to split up that time. Thank you Pastor Christine!

She has chosen to do this to help lessen the complications of being without a called pastor for three months straight.

Pastor Christine has already provided for coverage during the time that she is away. While she is gone, please note: she will not be attending to funerals, pastoral care, emails, texts, or any online connection for St. John's during her sabbatical time.

In the event of pastoral emergencies, we would ask that you call the church office for assistance during that time. Again, the dates for her first segment of the sabbatical are May 13th through June 23rd. She will return to the office on the 24th of June.

Thank you for praying for our pastor and please pray that this pause in ministry will be restful for her.

From Pastor Christine

Yes! We're the Church Together!

As we begin our journey towards the summer months and VBS is close at hand, I am reminded of a song I learned as a child called "We are the church together." Perhaps you know it, too? It begins with these lyrics: "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together. All the little children, all around the world, yes, we're the church together." Today we may not sing that song as much anymore, but

the theology of the song is great. We all make up the church. I can't be the church by myself; nor can you be the church by yourself. Rather, it takes the whole body of Christ to be the church. As a reminder, too, the church is technically NOT a building. Of course, we say, 'we are going to church' while thinking of coming to this building, but the church itself isn't the building. The church is a called people, specifically that body we call the body of Christ. That's why the word church actually means "The Called Out Ones".

I think this is a great reminder as I look to beginning the first part of my sabbatical, which beings May 13th and goes through June 23rd. The church is not me. It's also not just you. It takes everyone to make this body work for good for the sake of the Gospel. You are so vital to what makes this fellowship function. Thank you so much for your part! However, the absence of a pastor is not a small thing either. St. John's is beginning a new journey in ministry with one called pastor. Having been used to two in the past, it makes the whole sabbatical concept one of mystery and newness.

So, here are just some basics about pastoral care coverage while I am away. I have lined up preaching pastors for the six Sundays while I am gone. For funerals and committals, I have a great list of amazing local pastors who have been so kind to say yes to being backups while I am away. If a death should occur, Genny in the office can assist you and the funeral director of your choice. I also will commission three people to do hospital and hospice visitation when requested. These three already do visitation since they are all on the Senior and Homebound Visitation Ministry: Dauneen Amundson, Lynn Yolitz, and Ruth Lundblad. I thank them so much for being a part of this ministry we all share together. Furthermore, we have our Executive Committee as well, who provide any support on the work of the business side or operating side of the church. Rely upon them when needed. They are wonderful assets to our ministry. Thank you, Jean Jirovec, Penny Erickson, Mike Kitzmann, and Dramus Peuse.

Lastly, thank you to all of you, the people of St. John's! A sabbatical means I have been here almost 14 years, and it is a blessing for me! Pastors don't stay in places where they are not supported. It says a lot about the welcome of this place of faith and the community, that you value your pastor and pray for her.

But I will think of you. I will pray for you. I wish you well. And I will be encouraged by your witness of Jesus while I am away. May the Risen Lord meet you and bring peace to your lives today and always.

Sunday, July 14th



tine would like to know if you plan to join the reading group before May 12th.



She encourages us to develop our capacity to feel the breadth of our experiences. The better we are at identifying our highs and lows, the more resilient we become. 


Brown Bag Kids For Kids

Where faith, food, and the climate crisis meet...

On Sunday, April 21 (Earth Day eve!) St. John's Caretakers of Creation team held a showing of the just-in-the-theaters, multiple-award-winning documentary, Common Ground. It was a big hit, packing the Promise Room and leading to a great discussion about regenerative agriculture.

What is it? Regenerative agriculture is a collection of techniques to preserve the soil that makes Earth habitable including: 1) planting cover crops, 2) growing diverse crops, 3) integrating livestock with crops, 4) protecting their root systems and 5) minimizing soil disruption. In exchange, society gains: a) improved nutrition, b) greater resistance to droughts and floods, c) increased yields, d) reduced carbon emissions, and e) benefits to farmers and ranchers resulting in revitalized communities.

How does this relate to our faith? A wide variety of agricultural references and practices are abundant in Christian scripture. The movie was shown on Good Shepherd Sunday, when we heard the good news of how Christ cares so much for his "livestock" that he gives up his life for his sheep. We remember the parable of the Sower – that seed falling on good soil yielded much grain – and we recall that we are all instructed to bear good fruit.

Within the ELCA, the 1993 Social Statement, <u>Caring for Creation</u>, "...summons our church, in its global work with poor people, to pursue sustainable development strategies... [and] to work with U.S. farmers who are turning to sustainable methods." More recently, the 2023 Social Message, <u>Earth's Climate Crisis</u>, calls for

"Increased incentives for long-lasting soil carbon sequestration and other regenerative practices on farms and ranches."

Sounds great, right? But you may wonder what you can do as a non-farmer... So here are several ideas recommended by <u>Regenerative Farmers of America</u>: 1. Buy local regenerative food 2. Buy regenerative national brands 3. Buy regenerative clothing 4. Start your own regenerative garden 5. Educate yourself 6. Spread Awareness 7. Educate the next generation 8. Support government policies to support regenerative agriculture.

Got an idea of how to support or even integrate these practices at St. John's? Or an idea of what the church can do to be more sustainable – to better care for God's creation? Just find a member of the committee (listed in the annual report) and let us know – we'd love your input!



St. John's 150 Years of Heritage & History 69 Years Ago, May 1, 1955

From the Leader-Telegram Thursday, Apr 28, 1955 (Including errors & omissions)

Published the Thursday before the May 1, 1955 dedication day.

> "CHURCH TO BE DEDICATED—

The new \$350,000 St. John's Lutheran Church, Highland Ave. and Chapin St., which will be dedicated Sunday.

Dedication services for the new \$350,000 church building of St. John's Lutheran Congregation will be held this Sunday, bringing a climax to 11 years of planning.

Since the congregation last went to dedication services "led by a brass band" 71 years ago, the membership has grown so that even plans for a motorcade to Sunday's dedication, after a farewell service in the old church were dropped because a traffic tie - up was foreseen.

The old church, located on the corner of S. Dewey and Gibson Sts., is approximately two miles from the new building on the East Side Hill, corner of Highland Ave. and Chapin St. building incorporates old Gothic



architecture throughout with the latest of modern conveniences. A

parking lot adjacent to the church can accommodate 90 cars.

A two - story Sunday School annex containing 23 classrooms, many of which can be made larger or smaller, according to needs, by means of sliding partitions, will accommodate 325 children.

Seating capacity in the church is 650. At present there are 1,100 communicant members in the congregation, and total membership is approximately 1,650. The Rev. Roy B. Schmeichel, serving since 1946, is the pastor.

THE NEW CHURCH virtually fireproof, being constructed of concrete, brick, and steel, and has a white limed oak trimming throughout. Exposed wooden beams and trusses in the nave of the church are the only exceptions in the construction. Asphalt tile covers the floors except for aisles, waiting room and pastor's study, which are rubber tiled. Stairways and landings at the entrances are of terrazzo tile.

On the first floor of the church is a chapel which can be connected with the nave to take care of overflow crowds by pushing back a sliding partition between the chapel and the narthex. Stained glass windows separating the narthex and the nave can be raised. The chapel has seating capacity of 93. The church balcony, which extends 30 feet from the back wall, will seat 114.

Also on the first floor is a mother's room with a loud speaker installed to connect it with the pulpit. A total of 28 loud speakers are located throughout the church, 10 of them upstairs and the rest installed in the basement ceiling. A nursery and kindergarten are also located on the first floor. An altar guild room, the pastor's study, and secretary's office are located in the front of the nave on either side of the altar.

A large stage with modern stage lighting is located in the basement at one end of a 50 by 75 foot assembly hall. A large, modern kitchen at the other end is fitted so that serving in the dining room located off the left of the assembly hall, is just as convenient as serving

to the larger room. It is estimated that 500 diners can be served at one sitting by using both rooms. An automatic dishwasher is among the featured conveniences in the kitchen.

FOR SMALL luncheons, a women's lounge equipped with a kitchenette unit and located on the first floor of the annex, is available.

Other features in the basement include a room set aside for the church Boy Scout troop, a combination choir and storage room, two classrooms, rest rooms, and the boiler room containing an oil hot water heating unit with a capacity of 8,000 gallons.

The church is designed so that coat racks on rollers, rather than permanent coat rooms, can be used.

Individual members of the congregation have donated practically all of the furnishings for the new church, including stained windows, pews, pulpit, lecturn, altar, chancel chairs, baptismal font, credence tables, offering plates, altar light, candle lighters, vases, chairs, and books.

ONLY FOUR MAJOR parts of the old church have been transferred to the new building. These include the altar, which will be used in connection with the Sunday School, the organ, an illuminated cross, and the church bell. The latter, which was cast in St. Louis in 1892, bears the inscription "Der Herr Ist Hier Und Ruft". (The Master Is Here and Calleth Thee).

Members of the building committee are Donald J. Brimmer and Egon Weiss, co-chairman; Fred Zachau, financial secretary; Mrs. L. C. Dunham, recording secretary; Miss Anna B. Bergman, Peter Bischoff, Mrs. E. A. Carlson, C. T. Hagen, Russell Holten, Ervin Iverson, and Mrs. John E. Kidd.

Members of the church council are Rev. Schmeichel, Russell Holten, president; Walter Black, vice president; Carl Ringer, recording secretary; Raymond Loehnis, youth director; Kenneth E. Krause, financial secretary; E. A. Otto, treasurer; Ervin Iverson, property superintendent; Alfred Anderson. Kermit Anderson. William Wrage, Donald Bunde, J. B. Turney, Gordon Ottum, Harold Smith, Val Manthel, Sr.

A week - long program, beginning with the dedication services, is planned. Three services will be held Sunday.

Guest speaker for the 9 a.m. dedication service, and also for the 10:45 a.m. service, will be the president of the Wisconsin District of the American Lutheran Church, Rev. Theodore Ohlrogge of Appleton.

At the 7:30 p.m. service, the Rev. George H. Vollmer, the only former pastor of St. John's still living will take over the pulpit. The Rev. Vollmer served the congregation here from 1933 to 1946, when he answered a call to become chaplain of the Milwaukee Hospital. He left there this Spring and now heads two parishes at Coloma, Wis.

Also on the dedication day schedule will be an open house from 2 to 5 Sunday afternoon.

At 7:30 p.m. Monday a program by the Sunday School is planned,

followed by an open house for the school; Tuesday at 7:45 p.m. the combined choirs under directors Mrs. Kermit Anderson, Junior Choir, and LaVerne Randen, Senior Choir, will present a concert; Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. the "Women of the Church" will serve a congregational banquet; Thursday the Junior Mission Bank will perform and youth organizations of the church will present a program under leadership of Ray Lorberter at 7:45 p.m.; and Friday, beginning at 7:45 p.m., will be fellowship night.

Just six pastors have served the congregation during its 81 year history from the time of the installation of the first regular pastor, the Rev. C. G. Mehrtens, in 1874. He was forced to resign a year later because of ill health.

The Rev. G. Meier than was installed and served until 1877, when he was succeeded by the Rev. George Recknagel. A history of the church written for the 75th anniversary reported that "the congregation had a membership of 46 in good standing" in September of 1890 when the Rev. A. F. Augustine took up the pastorate.

The Rev. Augustine served the congregation for 43 years, retiring Sept. 1, 1933 because of failing eyesight. At that time the Rev. Vollmer accepted the call here, and served until 1946. On Oct. 6 of that year the present pastor, the Rev. Schmeichel, was installed."





St. John's 150 Years of Heritage & History Dedication of Dewey St. Church

140 Years Ago June 27, 1884

Sunday's Sanctity.

The dedication of the new St. John's church (German Lutheran) situated at the south east corner of Gibson and Dewey streets, which last is now a street infact, as well as name baving been opened as far as Kelsey, was a most impressive sight. At half past nine, a procession was formed at the old church building on Galloway street, whence it moved to the new. The Eau Claire cornet band marched at the head. Rev. G. Racknagel, the pastor, Rev. Baumback of Fall Creek, Ray. Hoering, of Watertown, and Rey. Weyravch of Menomonie, carrying the sacred paraphernalia followed, then came the Sunday school children in white robes and then the rest of the congregation. The dedication ceremonies were held in the vestibule, after which the band filed into the gallery, and discourses were delivered in German by the paster and visiting clergymen. The inside yery of the church is handsome, and it was beautifully ted with garlands. In the afternoon Rev. G. Hoyme, of the Scandinavian Evangelical church of the conference preached in English. A handsome par. sonage will shortly be erected near the church.

After worshipping for ten years in a much smaller building on Galloway St; four lots were purchased for a new house of worship. On June 27, 1884, after nearly three years of raising funds, the dedication of the new St. John's German Lutheran Church on Dewey St. was held.
