A Message From Pastor Christine

It's November, the month where gratitude and thankfulness both take a front seat. One of my favorite readings from the Bible is often used during this month as we reflect upon our blessings: From Philippians 1:3-11 (NIV): "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

There is an old song that I love to sing by Irving Berlin called "Count Your Blessings" and the text goes like this: "When you're worried and cannot sleep, just count your blessings instead of sheep, and you'll go to sleep counting your blessings." Sounds easy, right? Easier said than done! Looking around these days, it seems more like anger, frustration, and conflict are counted within our country, communities, and even our households. Things are hard for many people. And, yet the practice of gratitude (something God gave us as a gift for our brains to thrive), can have such a positive effect on us.

It's often hard to be grateful when things are deeply strained whether in the workplace, home, or at school. Our longing for things to be different than what they actually are is difficult and tiring. We often resist the reality of what is, especially if it is unpleasant. And, when that happens, gratitude can not only feel oversimplified, but it can also feel forced like we are dragging ourselves through it hoping it will make us feel better. But positivity for its own sake is not actually gratitude or happiness and dare I say, not even positive.

This is why I never found saying what my blessings are an effective way to feel better, even when I would do it repeatedly to have a better frame of mind. Perhaps it works for other people and likely does. But, for me, it always somehow felt that I was trying push me into another practice or to avoid hard things that were present, to somehow minimize what was difficult; until that is, I began to see my own part in the blessings, a practice that I was taught while doing Church of the Wild training.

So, here is a little exercise that we can all do to gain a bit more gratitude and thankfulness in our lives as we approach Thanksgiving. But I recommend you practice this daily for a month and then see where it takes you. The hope is that it will build up what is called neuroplasticity in training your brain to have gratitude. It's called a GRATITUDE JAR.

As difficult as gratitude is some days, there are always things for which to be thankful without minimizing what our difficulties are. God also knows our struggles but that does not mean we cannot find ways to see the goodness and blessings. Let's do a gratitude exercise together. Try it out. Try it on. In the month of November, write down on little slips of paper something you notice makes you smile. Or, if a little kind thing you see, hear, or experience happens, write it down. Put those little things on paper and put them in the jar. You will likely forget what they all are, but they will add up. At the end of the week, open the jar and read what you wrote down. Then, start the exercise again the next week. This exercise will encourage "neuroplasticity" of the brain and hopefully will start to compensate for the negative things around you.

In this season of gratitude, like Paul said to his community of faith, I am also thankful for you. You are a part of the many blessings for which I give thanks to God. May we all know how blessed we are to call ourselves a family of faith together. Happy Thanksgiving! Pastor Christine

Caretakers of Creation Cold Weather Care for Birds

The birds who winter here in Wisconsin are looking for our help. Here is what you can do. Get some bird feeders and provide high-calorie, high-protein food like suet, sunflower seeds, and mealworms. Also maintain a constant supply of fresh water (maybe a heated bowl.) Keep the birdfeeders clean and restock them daily. Leave some shelter in your yard such as brush piles. The 2025 U.S. State of Birds report shows that more than 1/3 of U.S. bird species are of high or moderate conservation concern. The decline in bird populations are due to habitat loss, extreme weather, and cat predation. Everything we can do will help!

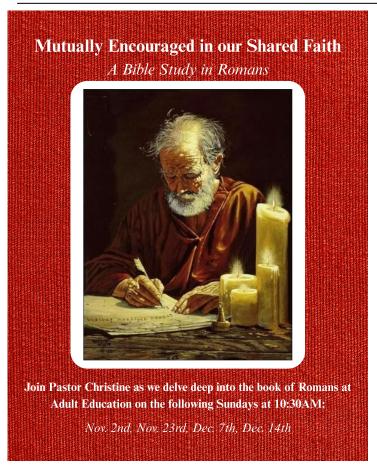

This month, we will have a chance to practice gratitude and to share with our community. We would like to invite the St. John's Congregation to join in and help us with our drive.

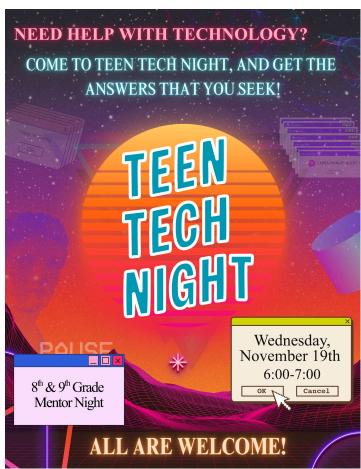

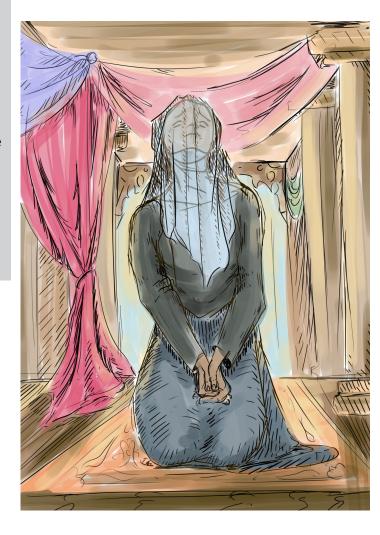
