

A Message From Pastor Christine

ALL IN – Lent 2026

As many of you know, Jim and I traveled almost exactly to the other side of the world to vacation in New Zealand after the holidays. There was something surreal about getting into a large metal cylinder for 15 hours over a very large ocean only to step out into summer and beautiful ocean and mountains! It's a privilege, that's for sure. But, I will say that once you are on a plane for that duration, there is no turning back. We were ALL IN on the adventure, no matter how it would turn out (fortunately, it was awesome!)

And, just as we went all around the world, we have somehow also seemed to have gone all the way around the year back to the Lenten journey already (Is it just me or do the years get faster?). On February 18th, we enter the discipline again, a discipline that for me always has such meaning spiritually. Lent is a season of repentance; that is, turning to God and asking for God's goodness to wipe away our sins and show us how to live anew each day. But Lent is also about turning away from the things which bind us toward Easter and the abundant life God offers. Lent is a time when we are ALL IN. Yes, the journey of discipleship is all year long, but this turning back reminds us to start again, to remember the why and the how, to pause in the dormancy of a winter life and allow God to work on us.

When was the last time you went ALL IN on something? Maybe it was taking a new job or entering a profession. Perhaps it was when you bought a house or decided to join this congregation. Maybe it was the day you were finally baptized as an adult. Going all in on something is powerful, frightening, and honest.

When it comes to faith in the Triune God, Jesus is eager to help us go all in on what it is to participate in the reign of God. Before we can go all in, though, God shows us the way and because God already knows it will be a challenge for us to enter into this broken world in a tangible way, God goes all in on our behalf first. We see this in scripture. Christ heals, teaches, reveals, suffers, dies and rises. Through the highs and the lows, Christ goes all in on both, pouring out the love of God for the world.

What do you say? Shall we go all in for Jesus and his love this Lent? We begin February 18th, Ash Wednesday at noon and 7pm, going all in for repentance. Then, for the five weeks of Lent at 7pm, we will focus upon these themes:

- All in for Creation
- All in for the Unknown
 - All in for Wonder
- All in for Relationship
- All in for Letting Go

As the Creator has been all in for you, go now and be all in for the sake of the world. Let's do this together.

Notice to the congregation

You are hereby notified that the church council is recommending a suspension of the following 3 Articles as written in our constitution. These include C12.02, "Congregation Council members shall be eligible to serve no more than six years consecutively, C.11.03, "no elected officer is eligible to serve more than four consecutive terms in the same office "and C13.13(a), "Ministry members shall be eligible to serve no more than two full terms consecutively". Please note that these Articles limit the number of consecutive years a council member can serve in one position.

When we have people who are willing to serve beyond these limits, these Articles do not allow this to occur. Our volunteerism is down and finding committed people willing to serve is becoming more difficult. This action will be reviewed before the next annual meeting in 2027. We have become aware that these Articles no longer adequately serve the needs of our congregation. On 1/15/2026, the Council unanimously passed the following motion:

"A motion to temporarily suspend Articles C12.02, C11.03, and C13.13(a) which limits the number of years a council member may serve in one position. This will be reviewed before the next annual meeting in 2027."

This notice satisfies the 30 day requirement necessary to proposing this action at the annual meeting on February 22, in accordance with our constitution.
